

In a statement by FORTNITE, any OG skin could come back in their original form. Black Knight is the most popular skin in the game. You could only get Black Knight by getting to level 70. Every skin is getting remixed.



Calamity, a skin from season 6, will be included in the remixes. Other possible skins that may be included in the remix are Rust Lord Dark Voyager, Sparkle Specialist, Omega, Drift, Linx, and Hybrid. There are still updates to come on the details of what is included in the OG season release.

The United States gets more than 1,200 tornadoes every year, which is four times more than Europe. Violent tornadoes, rated EF4 or EF5 on the Enhanced Fujita Scale, happen more in the U.S. than anywhere else. One of the fastest tornadoes ever recorded was the 1974 Guin tornado, which moved at 75 mph (121 km/h).

The deadliest tornado in history was the Daulatpur–Saturia tornado in Bangladesh on April 26, 1989. It killed about 1,300 people. The Enhanced Fujita Scale rates tornadoes from F0 (weak, with winds up to 72 mph) to F5 (very strong, with winds around 300 mph). Most tornadoes are rated between F0 and F3.

There have been tornadoes for a very long time. A tornado hit Freising, in what is now Germany, in the year 788. The earliest-known Irish tornado happened on April 30, 1054, in Rostella near Kilbeggan.

## **Roger Angell**

In his Forward to *The Elements of Style* Roger Angell wrote that the first writer he watched at work was his stepfather E.B White. Each Tuesday morning White would close his study door and sit down to write the "notes and comments" for *The New Yorker*. He was required to file a few hundred words of editorial or personal commentary. Hours went by when the copy went off at last, in the afternoon RFD (Rural Federal Delivery) pouch. "It isn't good enough," was this recurring question, put to himself.

Angell was the son of Katharine Sergeant Angell White, The New Yorker's first fiction editor, and the stepson of renowned essayist E. B. White, but he was raised for the most part by his father, Ernest Angell, an attorney who became head of the American Civil Liberties Union and Joel White is his (half-brother).

Mr. White, his stepfather, was inspired to revive and add to a textbook he had first read in college by William Strunk, Jr., an English professor at Cornell University, and then get it published as what became *The Elements of Style*. White had known that a collection of specific tips- about singular and plural verbs.

**Roger Angell** (September 19, 1920 – May 20, 2022) was an American essayist known for his writing on sports, especially <u>baseball</u>.

He became *The New Yorker*'s fiction editor in the 1950s, occupying the same office as his mother, and continued to write for the magazine until 2020.

"I've been accused once in a while of being a poet laureate, which has always sort of pissed me off," Angell told me (sportswriter Steve Kettmann) one afternoon in his office at *The New Yorker*.

Founded in 1925, *The New Yorker* is an American weekly magazine featuring journalism, commentary, criticism, essays, fiction, satire, cartoons and poetry.

## **How Harriet Tubman Fought Slavery**


First, during the civil war, Harriet Tubman worked with the union army to gather intelligence and help slaves travel to the north. She dressed as a field hand identifying and mapping Confederate mines, supply areas, and troops.

THEN, In June 1863, Tubman led an armed raid along the Combahee River, becoming the first woman to do so in U.S. military history. The raid freed more than 750 people from slavery

FINALLY, during a ten-year span she made 19 trips into the South and escorted over 300 slaves to freedom And, as she once proudly pointed out to Frederick Douglass, in all her journeys she "never lost a single passenger."



After the Civil War, Harriet settled with family and friends on land she owned in Auburn, New York. She married former enslaved man and Civil War veteran Nelson Davis in 1869 (her husband John had died 1867) and they adopted a little girl named Gertie a few years later October 29, 2009.

- 1. "I grew up like a neglected weed ignorant of liberty, having no experience of it. Then I was not happy or contented..."
- 2. "Every time I saw a white man I was afraid of being carried away." "If a person would send another into bondage, he would, it appears to me, be bad enough to send him into hell if he could."
- 3." Then there was the constant threat of capture. So-called slave catchers and their dogs roamed both sides of the Mason-Dixon line, nabbing runaways—and sometimes free Black people like Solomon Northup—and transporting them back to the plantation, where they would be whipped, beaten, branded or killed."
- 4." Despite the horrors of slavery, it was no easy decision to flee. Escaping often involved leaving behind family and heading into the complete unknown, where harsh weather and lack of food might a wait."
- 5." All told, in the decades preceding the Civil War, up to 100,000 Black people escaped slavery. Some went to Mexico or Spanish-controlled Florida or hid out in the wilderness. Most, though, traveled to the Northern free states or Canada."

bury. Mrs. Harriet Tribbman a fugititive from Slavery, also spoke in a most thrilling manner of her experiences in Slavery; her escape, and her wonderful success in leading others out of the worse than Egyptian bondage. We were told that she had led more than a hundred and fifty into Canada; and that she was called 'Moses' in some places, from her remarkable deliverances of God's people out of the hands of Southern Pharoahs.

## The Story of Jalen Milroe

Jalen Milroe was born in Katy, Texas on December 13, 2002 where he started his football career at the age of five. When he was young, they knew that he was going to be a star. He attended Tompkins high school in Katy, Texas. He didn't play football his freshman year, but he did play football his sophomore year where he would throw for 1,404 yards, 10 touchdowns, and three interceptions.

In his junior year he came into the season as a three-star recruit. He would show college scouts what he could really do by throwing for 3,000 yards, 29 touchdowns, and eight interceptions, and he would go on to win the state championship.

His Senior season he came into the season as a five star with over 30 Division One football offers. This season he would throw for 1,257 yards, two interceptions, and 13 offers and would go on to win another state championship. At the end of the season, he would have to commit to a college school, and he chose the university of Alabama. His freshman year season he would not get in at all but he would try to capitalize from his freshman year he would get in a bit but only had 297 passing yards and five touchdowns and three interceptions.

And his junior is where he would start to become the star, he was always meant to be he would have 2,834 passing yards, 23 passing touchdowns, 6 interceptions, and 531 rushing yards and 12 rushing touchdowns and would lead his team all the way to the rose bowl but would fall short to the national champions Michigan. His senior season 2,652 passing yards, 15 passing touchdowns, 10 interceptions and would rush for 719 yards, 20 rushing touchdowns. He now plays there practicing for the Reliabowl versus Michigan and would his team to a 9-3 record and he will declare for the NFL draft this year.

## The Story of Jerimiah Smith

Jerimiah was born in Miami Gardens Florida on November 29, 2005. He began his amazing football career at the age of seven years old when he tried out for the Miami Gardens Ravens youth football league. Unfortunately, he did not make it and cried. But his dad told him he would be better than everybody in Florida - so all he did was take that as motivation and the following year, Smith made the league and won its own version of the Heisman Trophy. By the time he was in middle school he was the best football player in Miami.

He easily made the team and became the #1 wide receiver. After going crazy in Pop Warner youth football, he started his high school career at Chaminade-Madonna. He did not play his freshman year but his sophomore year he had 31 receptions, 556 receiving yards, and 7 touchdowns. His junior year he had a breakout season with 1098 receiving yards, 20 touchdowns, and 63 receptions. He and his team would go on to win the 1M football state championship.

He had an even better season his senior year with 1,389 receiving yards, 19 touchdowns, and 90 receptions. His team was the first all American team and he would win player of the year and he and his team would go on to win another state championship.

But Jeremiah still had to decide what school he had to commit to for his collegiate career. After having over 40+ offers he would ultimately commit to Ohio State. His freshman year he had 1,227 receiving yards, 14 touchdowns, and 71 receptions and his team will be playing in the national championship game against the powerhouse Notre Dame.

He will probably stay at Ohio State for the rest of his college career.

## The Story of Ryan Williams

Ryan Williams was born on February 9, 2007, in Mobile, AL. When Ryan was 5 years old, he started playing football. He wanted to play the running back position, but his coach made him play quarterback in his first game and his family knew he was going to be a true star.

The reason he started playing football was because of his dad his father he was a star cornerback in the 2000's.

Ryan played football in middle school and was a star wide receiver, then he started playing football in his play his freshman year, racking up 289 receiving yards and 4 touchdowns, and 117 rushing yards and 2 touchdowns,

He was a 2-star recruit at the end of the freshman season. In his sophomore year he racked up 1,641 receiving yards and 24 touchdowns. For rushing ,he had 700 rushing yards 15 touchdowns, and for passing 41 yards and 1 touchdown, His team would go on to win the state championship and that was the end of his sophomore season.

#### Ice sheets

The North and South Poles are covered by ice sheets, which are glaciers that cover more than 50,000 square kilometers of land. The Antarctic Ice Sheet is about the size of the United States and Mexico combined. Ice forms when water molecules slow down and stick and stick to gather ice forms when water freezes, which can happen in a few ways:

- Water vapor to frost or snowflakes
- When temperatures drop below 0°C (32°F), water vapor in the atmosphere turns into frost or snowflakes. Frost forms at ground level, while snowflakes form in clouds.

## Liquid water to ice

When liquid water freezes, it forms a solid like river ice, sea ice, hail, or ice made in a refrigerator.

 Sea ice density: Ice is about 8.3% less dense than liquid water, which means it expands by 9% when it freezes.

New sea ice, a general term used for recently frozen sea water that does not yet make up solid ice, is very salty because it contains brine droplets trapped between ice crystals. As the ice ages, the brine drains out, and multiyear ice is usually fresh enough to drink.

#### Thermal conductivity

The metal of a flagpole conducts heat quickly, which is why a tongue freezes almost immediately when it touches the metal surface.

#### Dry ice

Dry ice is the solid form of carbon dioxide. It's colorless, odorless, and non-flammable. It originates in clouds when temperatures are below the freezing point (0 degrees Celsius, or 32 degrees Fahrenheit), when water vapor in the atmosphere condenses directly into ice without going through the liquid stage.

But fossils don't show any feathers on T. rex. Rather, well-preserved T-REX.

Tesla's Cybertruck is an electric pickup truck with a stainless-steel alloy exoskeleton and a design inspired by <u>Blade Runner</u> and "<u>Wet Nellie</u>", the <u>Lotus Esprit</u> driven by <u>James Bond</u> in <u>The Spy Who Loved Me</u>.

There are no door handles on the Cybertruck. The door locks and unlocks via an external button hidden on the pillars next to them. Additionally, all door open to 90 degrees for easy ingress and egress.

As of October 2024, industry experts estimate that at least 27,185 Cybertrucks have been sold. That's more than Ford's f-150 lightning, Rivian's R1T, and Chevy's Silverado EV.

The Tesla Cybertruck is an all-electric, stainless steel pickup truck with several unique features, such as spacious cabin, 18.5" and 9.4" touchscreens, 15 speakers, and a built-in HEPA filter. It also has:

20" wheels

16" ground clearance in extract mode A towing capacity of 14,000+ pounds A payload of 3,500 lbs. 100 cubic feet of exterior lockable storage Steer-by-wire and rear steering

In terms of performance, the Cybertruck can go from 0 to 60 mph in under 2.9 seconds. The "Cyberbeast" variant can accelerate from 0 to 60 mph in 2.6 seconds. The top speed is governed to 131 mph.

**Range**: The base rear-wheel drive variant has an estimated range of 250 miles. The all-wheel drive and "Cyberbeast" variants have an estimated range of 340 miles and 320 miles, respectively.

Charging: The Cybertruck can add up to 128 miles of charge in 15 minutes.

**Warranty**: The basic vehicle warranty is 4 years or 50,000 miles, whichever comes first. The battery and drive unit warranty are eight years or 150,000 miles, whichever comes first.

According to *Car and Driver*, the 2025 Tesla Cybertruck completed the quarter mile in 11.0 seconds at 119 mph. Its top speed is governed to 131 mph.

The ultra-hard stainless-steel exoskeleton helps to reduce dents, damage and long-term corrosion. Repairs are simple and quick. Armor Glass can resist the impact of a baseball at 70 mph or class 4 hail. Acoustic glass helps make the cabin as quiet as outer space.

Britannica gives the following early history of cheerleading as a sport in the U.S.":

"Although cheerleading is today predominantly associated with femininity, the original cheerleaders were men. Cheerleading was connected to the emergence of gridiron football at Ivy League colleges and universities in the United States in the mid-1800s, and the growth and formalization of cheerleading paralleled that of football. Over the latter half of the 19th century, as attendance at college games grew, large stadiums were constructed, and spectators were distanced from the playing field. Cheerleaders — or "yell leaders," as they were then called — led cheers from the sidelines both to encourage the spectators and to serve as a form of crowd control. By the 1920s cheerleading had become a formal extracurricular activity for boys in high schools, colleges, and communities across the country, related to but distinct from other spirit programs such as marching bands, drum corps, and drill teams. As ambassadors for their schools and communities, cheerleaders were associated with such character-building traits as discipline, cooperation, leadership, and sportsmanship."

#### **Cheerleading Becomes Female**

Yell leaders were primarily male up until World War II, even though women were permitted to be on cheerleading teams. When the men went off to war, women took over as cheerleaders. And when the war was over, cheerleading was primarily a female activity. According to usacheer.org, today females account for approximately 85% of participants.

## The First Black Girl to Go to a White School

On November 14, 1960, at the age of six, Ruby Bridges changed history and became the first African American child to integrate an all-white elementary school in the South.

Ruby Nell Bridges was born in Tylertown, Mississippi, on September 8, 1954, the daughter of sharecroppers. Seeking a better life in a big city, her parents moved the family to New Orleans when Ruby was four years old.

In 1954, in a landmark case, Brown v. Board of Education, the Supreme Court ruled unanimously that racial segregation of children in public schools was unconstitutional. The fact that Ruby was born the same year as the decision to desegregate schools is notable in her journey as a civil rights activist.

When Ruby was in kindergarten, her parents allowed her to test to see if she qualified to integrate into New Orleans public schools, even though her father was hesitant. Ruby was one of six Black children to pass the test. Two of the six students decided to remain in their current school. Three of them transferred to McDonogh No. 19 Elementary. And Ruby was sent to William Frantz Elementary School.

On the first day in her new school, Ruby and her mother arrived with four U.S. marshals for protection. Ruby saw a massive crowd of people shouting, throwing things, and carrying signs as she approached the school.

Halloween evolved from a few ancient and medieval holidays, including the Celtic festival of Samhain, Christian feasts of the dead, and All Saints' Day:

- Samhain: A pagan festival that marked the end of summer and the beginning of the new year in early medieval Ireland. The Celts believed that the veil between the worlds of the living and the dead was thin on Samhain, and that spirits roamed the earth. To ward off ghosts, people would wear costumes, darken their faces with ashes, and light bonfires.
- All Saints' Day: A Christian holiday celebrated on November 1 to honor all saints.
- All Souls' Day: A Christian feast of the dead celebrated on November 2. The name
   "Halloween" comes from the Christian All Souls' Day, which was also known as "All-

- hallows". The evening before All Souls' Day became known as All Hallows' Eve, and eventually shortened to Halloween.
- American colonists brought Halloween to the United States, where it was influenced by a variety of cultures. In the New World, Halloween became a time for parties, where people would dress up, read fortunes, tell scary stories, and set out food for loved ones. The practice of trick-or-treating also originated in America.
- Other Halloween traditions include carving jack-o'-lanterns, which may be based on a legend about Stingy Jack, who is a legend. In fact, the name, jack-o'-lantern, comes from an Irish folktale about a man named Stingy Jack. Stingy Jack, whose clever yet mischievous interactions with the Devil birthed the treasured tradition of the Jack O'Lantern.

Fun Fact: Did you know that the world's largest Jack O'Lantern was carved from a pumpkin weighing over 2,000 pounds? It's fascinating how a simple tradition rooted in ancient Irish folklore has blossomed into a beloved global phenomenon. (The record was set in 2010, showcasing the evolving enthusiasm for this timeless tradition.)

Rowling's mother was with the Wrens and her father with the Royal Navy.

The Rowlings settled in Yate, where Pete started work as an assembly-line production worker at the Bristol Sudeley factory. The company became part of Rolls Royce, a car company, and worked his way into management as a chartered engineer.

## Who Invented Hair Products?

Madam C. J. Walker was influential to the Industrial Revolution because of her inventions, social contributions, and long-term impacts. She was not only an inventor who created hair care products, she was also a civil rights activist.

Madam C. J. Walker (December 23, 1867- May 25, 1919). She promoted her products by traveling around the country giving lecture- demonstrations and eventually established Madam C.J. walker laboratories to manufacture cosmetics and train sales beauticians. Her business abilities made her to be one of the first American women to become a self-made millionaire.

Madam C. J. Walker was an incredibly motivated woman. During the 1890s, she began to suffer from a scalp ailment that caused her to lose majority of her hair. Because of this, she decided to investigate developing and selling hair products "specifically for African American Hair." In 1905 she created her own hair growth product that also helped to heal diseases of the scalp. Her line of hair care products for Black women, including a shampoo and pomade, and a method for conditioning the scalp. Her "Walker system" was designed to promote hair growth and make hair soft and luxuriant.



She started making her own products by experimenting with ingredients. Madam C. J. Walker's first products were called "Madam Walker's Wonderful Hair Grower."

Madam C. J. Walker also had her own way of selling things called the "Walker Method." The Walker Method" involved her going from door to door selling her products.

In 1927 she created her very own clean beauty school to train her employes.

She achieved all this while being the first free person in her family and she accomplished most of these accolades with no formal education.

After she died on May 25, 1919, she gave some of her money to charities and the rest to her daughter.

Walker became one of the wealthiest women in America. That remarkable wealth allowed her to construct of her own 34-room Italian villa, "Villa Leward Estate" in Irvington, New York. The stunning home is also notable because it was designed by New York's first African American licensed African American architect in New York State.



# Who Was the First Black Disney Princess?

Now let's get to know about prince Naveen a little bit. Bruno Campos played Prince Naveen, the the eldest prince of the kingdom Madonia, who was transformed into a frog by a voodoo witch doctor. Naveen is a 20-year-old musician and playboy who has been cut off from his family's riches until he learns the value of responsibility.

Now let's some more of Tiana, shall we. One of the quotes Anika Noni Rose shared with all the black girls and boys today is "When we don't include children of color in fantasy, we are saying that they don't exist in that kind of space of adventure and imagination."



On June 11, 2024 the Associated Press reported that a new attraction starring the first Black Disney princess ever opened at the company's U.S. theme parks, Disney followers see it as fitting for a former ride based on a movie that contained a lot of racist expressions.

The new theme park attraction updates Tiana's storyline from the 2009 animated film "The Princess and the Frog" opened in the space previously occupied by <u>Splash Mountain</u>. The <u>Splash Mountain</u> water ride had been themed to "Song of the South," a 1946 Disney movie filled with racist cliches about African Americans and plantation life.

"For little Black girls, Tiana has meant a lot. When a little child can see somebody who looks like them, that matters," said Neal Lester, an English professor at Arizona State University, who has written about Tiana.

Disney's announcement that it would transform its longstanding *Splash Mountain* ride into Tiana's Bayou Adventure was made in June 2020 following the social justice protests sparked by the murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis police custody. At the time, Disney said the change had already been in the works. But it came as companies across the U.S. were reconsidering or renaming decades-old brands amid worldwide protests.

The "Song of the South" film is a mix of live action, cartoons and music featuring an older Black man who works at a plantation and tells fables about talking animals to a white city boy. The film has been criticized for its racist stereotypes hasn't been released in theaters in decades and isn't available on the company's streaming service.

Tiana, introduced in 2009, made history as **the first black Disney princess**. Her journey paved the way for more diverse princesses to shine and inspired other countless young viewers to dream big. Tiana really set a positive role model on some other black girls to be like her and life and its really great to know there are not just other princesses but black princesses.

Tesla was founded in July 2003, by Martin Eberhard and Marc Tarpenning as Tesla Motors. Its name is a tribute to the inventor and electrical engineer.







### The New Yorker Influences Society

Founded on February 21, 1925, the *New Yorker*, delivered weekly across America, is known for its varied literature and humor.

The New Yorker has had a great influence on society as well as shaping journalism standards, humor, and magazine biographies. It's influence through facts, and it's form of journalism has changed society.

Prominent writers have tackled complex cultural and political issues, shaping the public exchange of opinions and influencing the way people understand the world around them. There were many contributors to the New Yorker. Between 1946 and 1951, J.D. Salinger published seven stories and soon after in 1954 John Updike began to publish short stories and poems in the New Yorker until his death.

Noted for his joking short stories, S.J. Perelman was an American humorist and screen writer. Needing a book critic, Dorthy Parker was a big contributor as a *celebrated* author, reviewer, and poet.

E.B White was a contributing author and writer for the New Yorker. Katharine Sergeant Angell met E. B. White in 1926 at The New Yorker magazine. Katharine had joined the staff of the New Yorker as an editor in August of 1925. They married in 1929.

Roger Angell was Katharine's son, the stepson of E.B White.

White is celebrated for editing and updating <u>The Elements of Style</u>, a handbook of grammatical and stylistic guidance for writers of <u>American English</u>. In 2023 *Time* listed the *The Elements of Style* as *one of the 100 best and most influential non-fiction books* written in English.

Roger Angell, who wrote the forward to *The Elements of Style* was an American author and editor and became a fiction editor in the New Yorker. Roger Angell spent the duration of his life working for the magazine.

Harold Ross and his wife Jane Grant, the founders of the New Yorker, gave a great impact on today's society on writing and journalism. Ross died in 1951 and <u>Jane Grant</u>, was its <u>editor-in-chief</u> until her death in 1972.

## **The Tortured Poets Department (TTPD)**

The Tortured Poets Department is the eleventh studio album by the American singer-songwriter Taylor Swift, released on April 19, 2024, through Republic Records. It was expanded into a double album two hours after its release, subtitled *The Anthology*, containing a second volume of songs. Swifties believe the *Midnights* singer referenced Matty Healy – whom she briefly dated after Joe Alwyn and was caught kissing at New York City's Casa Cipriani in May 2023 – in the title track of her album.

"The tracks from TORTURED POETS DEPARTMENT are: 'Fortnight (feat. Post Malone,' 'The Tortured Poets Department,' 'My Boy Only Breaks His Favorite Toys,' 'Down Bad,' 'So Long, London,' 'But Daddy I Love Him,' 'Fresh Out The Slammer,' 'Florida!!! (feat. Florence and the Machine'."

On *The Tortured Poets Department*, Taylor Swift sends fan a message about their obsession with her relationships. We've heard Taylor Swift sing about her romantic relationships and spin stories out of history. In her new album, *The Tortured Poets Department*, Swift explores another topic: fame.



Some critics have praised the album for its "unbridled emotion" and "moments of genuine humor." Others say that Swift has reached a crossroads in her creative process, calling for a stricter edit.

Produced by Swift, Jack Antonoff, and Aaron Dessner, the album is a minimalist synth-pop, folk-pop, and chamber pop effort with rock and country stylings.

Five days after its release, *TTPD* became the first album in history to surpass one billion streams in a single week and is now the fastest album to hit the billion-stream milestone.

To no one's surprise, Swift, 34, is credited on all 16 of the album's tracks. She's also the sole songwriter on two TTPD songs: "Who's Afraid of Little Old Me?" and "My Boy Only Breaks His Favorite Toys." Swift's longtime collaborator, Jack Antonoff, is listed among the credits.

TTPD has much more power an comes closer to *Midnights* and *Reputation*. *Midnights* because of the synth style that grew more mature on *TTPD*, *Reputation* for the powerful vibes of her lyrics/message even though different genre. Synth pop is the right genre.



The longest song on the album is "But Daddy I Love Him," which clocks in at 5 minutes and 40 seconds. "I Can Fix Him (No Really I Can)" is the shortest at 2 minutes and 36 seconds.

Between sales and streams, *The Tortured Poets Department* has a total of 4.66 million album equivalent units through the first half of the year.

Taylor Swift is "completely blown away" by *Tortured Poets* spending 12 weeks at no. 1 on the Billboard 200. "That's never happened to an album of mine before, not even close!!" the pop superstar wrote.

Quoting Swift's words, "One of which being fatalism – longing, pining away, lost dreams. It's a very fatalistic album in that there are lots of very dramatic lines about life or death. 'I love you, it's ruining my life.' These are very hyperbolic, dramatic things to say. It's that kind of album."

It is clear why *The Tortured Poets Department* has been Taylor Swift's most successful album so far!

Fishers try not to catch turtles.












A minion sitting in the sun.

# Orcas By Coral Wilson



Orcas' nickname is killer whale. Even though orcas are also known as killer whales, they are the largest member of the dolphin family (females are usually smaller than males.) Orcas have specific features you can use to identify them. Orcas even prey on other whale species more than twice their size.


Killer Whales have large teeth on both their upper and lower jaw. The teeth are shaped like cones and interlock. They are 3 inches long and can be 4 inches long in adults. Unlike sharks, who go through 30,000 teeth in a lifetime, once a Killer Whale loses a tooth, they are not able to replace it.

The name "killer whale" comes from their original name "whale killers" given to them by sailors who saw them hunting other whales. The name orcas "aesina ballenas" or "whale killer" was eventually flipped around to "killer whale." The name "orca" comes from their Latin species name *Orcinus orca*, where *orcinus* translates to mean "kingdom of the dead."

Some orcas migrate long distances, for example, one was tracked travelling a non-stop roundtrip of almost 9,400 km! Orcas communicate through a range of clicks, whistles, pulsed calls, squeals, squeaks, and screams. Moving boats and underwater noise can disrupt orcas when they are feeding and affect their social interactions and echolocation. Fishing is a threat to orcas.

There are at least 10 different "ecotypes" around the world. Whilst they can and do eat prey such as finfish and marine mammals, New Zealand orcas have become specialized at hunting sharks and rays. The average life span of an orca is similar to a human, at 50-80 years for females and slightly less for males at 29-60 years.

Killer whales have no predators. Orcas, also known as killer whales, are among the most majestic and awe-inspiring creatures. Two predominant ecotypes of killer whales – Residents and Bigg's – show distinct preferences. Within orca pods, social dynamics are intriguingly structured around matrilineal lines. It means the women are in charge.

#### **Fun Facts About Red Foxes**

#### **Basic Facts**

Their common name is a red fox. Their scientific name is *vulpes vulpes*. It is a mammal and its diet is an omnivore. Its average lifespan in the wild is 2 to 4 years. Its average head and body size is 18 to 33.75 inches. Its average tail size is 12 to 21.75 inches. It weighs about 6.5 to 24 pounds.

#### **Physical Facts**

"Red foxes have long snouts and red fur across the face, back, sides, and tail." Their belly, chin, and throat are a grayish white color. Red foxes have black-tipped ears that are pointy and large, and feet that are black. "One of the most noticeable characteristics of the red fox is the fluffy, white-tipped tail." Red foxes are around 2 feet tall and 3 feet long.

"Red foxes are often confused with gray foxes, which share a similar habitat and range. This can make identification difficult, because some red foxes can have large patches of gray fur and gray foxes have patches of red fur." Gray foxes are usually smaller and have a shorter muzzle and they also have a rounder face. The best way to tell the difference is if you look at the color at the tip of the tail. Red foxes have white-tipped tails and gray foxes have black-tipped tails. "Although they are very similar in name and appearance, the gray fox and the red fox are only distant cousins, belonging to different genera in the family Candidae."

#### **Traits**

"The red fox is abundant, widely distributed over the United States. Relatively speaking, foxes can often be seen in national parks where they live."

"Color phases other than red occur, sometimes even in the same litters." Even though the common color is red, red foxes can be silver, black, or a cross between silver and red called a "cross fox." An outstanding white-tipped tail is a different feature of the phases of color.

Red foxes hunt by seeing, hearing, and smelling. They have amazing eyesight, a great sense of smell, and acute hearing. "Sometimes they wait patiently for the sound of a mouse moving along its path in grass or snow and then pounce; at other times, hearing movement underground, they dig quickly and locate the prey by its scent."

### **Coyote Facts**

"Coyotes, (Canis latrans) are a New World member of the dog family (Canidae) that is smaller and more lightly built than the wolf (Canis lupus)." The coyote's name is designated from the Aztec "coyote" which is found from Alaska southward going into America but mostly in the great plains. Truthfully, the eastern border is the range of the Appalachians.

From what I already know about coyotes, they are part of the wolf/dog family, but I heard that some people say they are also part of the fox or cat family. And so far, this information is correct.

Some people get confused with the difference between coyotes and wolves but, this may surprise you, there is a huge difference. One of the differences is the appearance. Coyotes have bushier tails with a black tip that usually hangs downward. Coyotes are a bit smaller than wolves and have narrower and pointier snouts, smaller paws, and occasionally larger, and more pointed ears than the ones of a wolf. Coyotes are medium in size. Their coat colors can be a mixture of tan, black, and gray, and can be mixed from black to strawberry blond. The usual Eastern adult coyote weighs around 30 to 35 pounds, with males being heavier than females.

Coyotes are very social animals; they don't form packs but rather live in family groups. They will usually travel and hunt alone but might join in loose pairs to take down prey. Coyotes have been known to even hunt cooperatively with other species! Coyotes are extremely adaptable and live in a wide range of habitats including forests, grasslands, deserts, swamps, and a few other habitats. They are usually excluded from locations with wolves and don't live in the same habitat as wolves. Coyotes, because of their tolerance for human actions, also occur in suburban, agricultural, and urban setting.

"There are nearly 36 species of marine dolphins living in nearly all aquatic environments." There are four unique kinds of dolphins living in the Amazon River.

When they are hunting, dolphins blow bubbles to herd their prey to the surface. Sometimes, they use their tail to hit fish and stun them. This is called fish-whacking.



**Fun Facts About Orcas** 

Orcas are the biggest member of the dolphin family. "In January 2019, an experienced group of killer whale biologists launched an expedition from the southern tip of Chile into some of the roughest waters in the world, searching for what could be a new species of killer whale."



**Dolphins vs. Orcas** 

Who would win in a fight: dolphins or orcas???? It depends on the dolphin species, but most likely a killer whale. Bottlenose dolphins are not fighters, and usually outsmart their predators. However, killer whales are equally as smart. Along with their strength, they would probably defeat the pod.



**More Facts About Dolphins** 

Bottlenose dolphins are often killed accidentally in gillnets, driftnets, purse seines, trawls, long-lines and on hook-and-line gear used in fisheries. In UK waters, bottlenose dolphins are one of the species most threatened by catch. WWF and its partners are working with fisheries across the world to test and encourage use of sustainable fishing gear. One solution is attaching

acoustic alarms, or 'pingers' to fishing nets alerts cetaceans to the presence of fishing gear helping them avoid it.

Bottlenose dolphins are one of the few species, along with apes and humans, that have the ability to recognize themselves in a mirror. This is considered 'reflective' of their intelligence. Dolphins are also among the few animals that have been documented using tools. In Shark Bay in Western Australia, dolphins fit marine sponges over their beaks to protect them from sharp, harmful rocks as they forage for fish.
